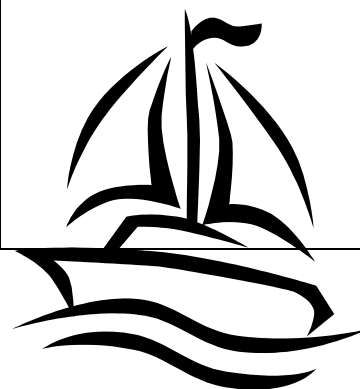

Up packed ready to go..... in less than two hours we'd be at 19341 feet. Tough climb it felt as if we took two steps and slid down one, very steep. Around 11am we were there atop of Kilimanjaro, **WE DID IT!** Tears Photos and hugs were shared and within twenty minutes we were on our way down. It took only five hours to get to 10000 feet and there we got to indulge in a beer. DAY EIGHT DONE. Early to bed early to raise. Another five hours and it was over. Well except for the won-
